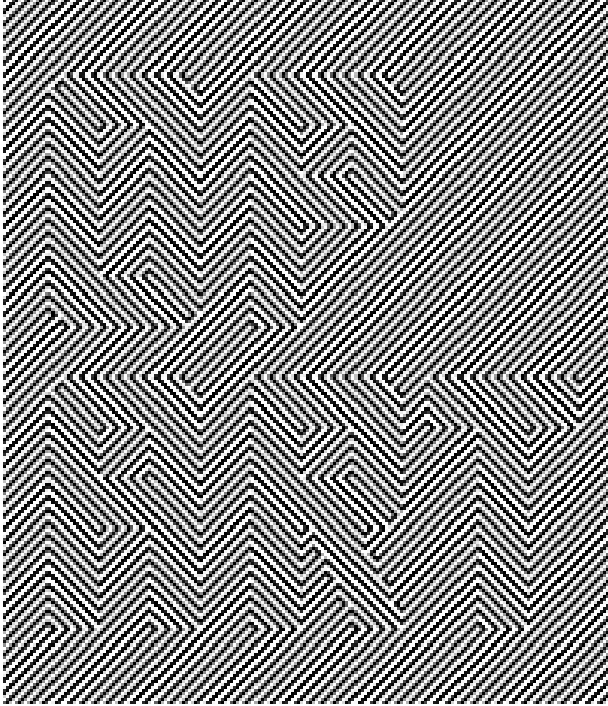


# Op Art
